N EWS FROM WOOTTON
PARISH COUNCIL

The council met on 19 June to deal with a varied agenda. Two big planning issues were discussed. One was the latest Botley West consultation which arrived only a few days before the meeting and certainly without enough time for us to study it properly. At first sight it does not look encouraging so we have arranged a special meeting for 24 July to agree our response. This means that the meeting originally planned for 1 July has been cancelled.

The other big planning concern is the application for the development at Woodleys. This is a complex development involving lots of changes including from residential to commercial, but with a lot of additional residential

capacity. The commercial use seems to cover virtually any activity, including events. We fear it could turn into something along the lines of Soho Farmhouse or even Estelle Manor so the planning committee is looking at the plans very carefully. Our local district councillors have been asked to help liaise with the WODC planners. David Knight and Fiona Mackinlay reported on the recent meeting of the Oxford Airport Consultative Committee. We plan to be able to respond more effectively to the Airport's current consultation, in order to tackle the growing problem of noise pollution from air traffic movements. We will be developing a new procedure for local people to be able to log complaints about low flying or excessive noise. Finally, please be warned that

there will be a major international conference in Blenheim on 17-18 July. Security arrangements are likely to be intrusive and we have already been warned there will be no stopping or parking allowed on the A44 between the Bladon roundabout and the junction just north of Judd's garage. In addition, ordinary local traffic may well be disrupted by the security arrangements.

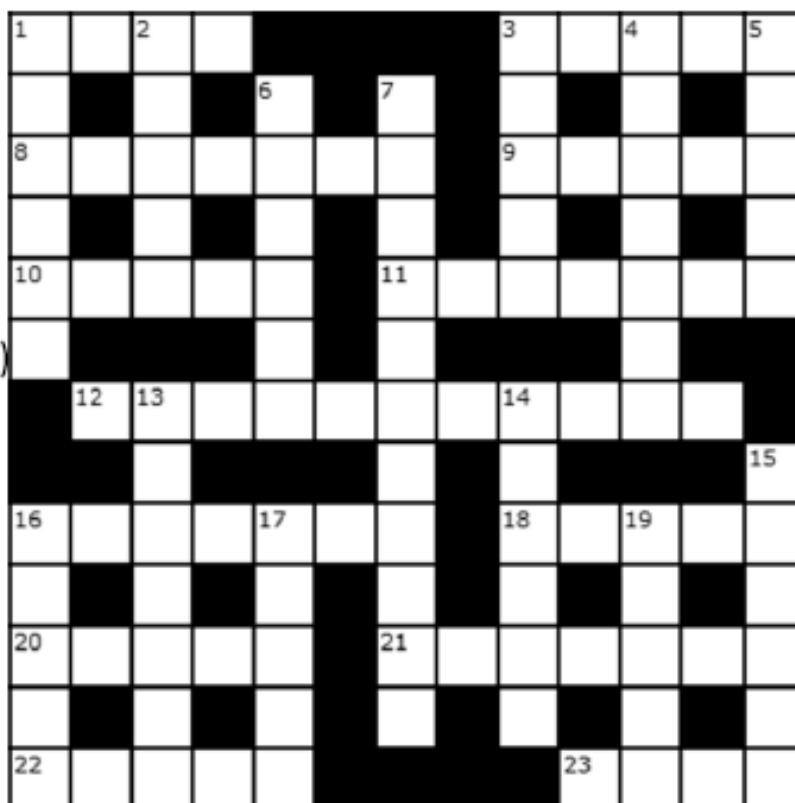

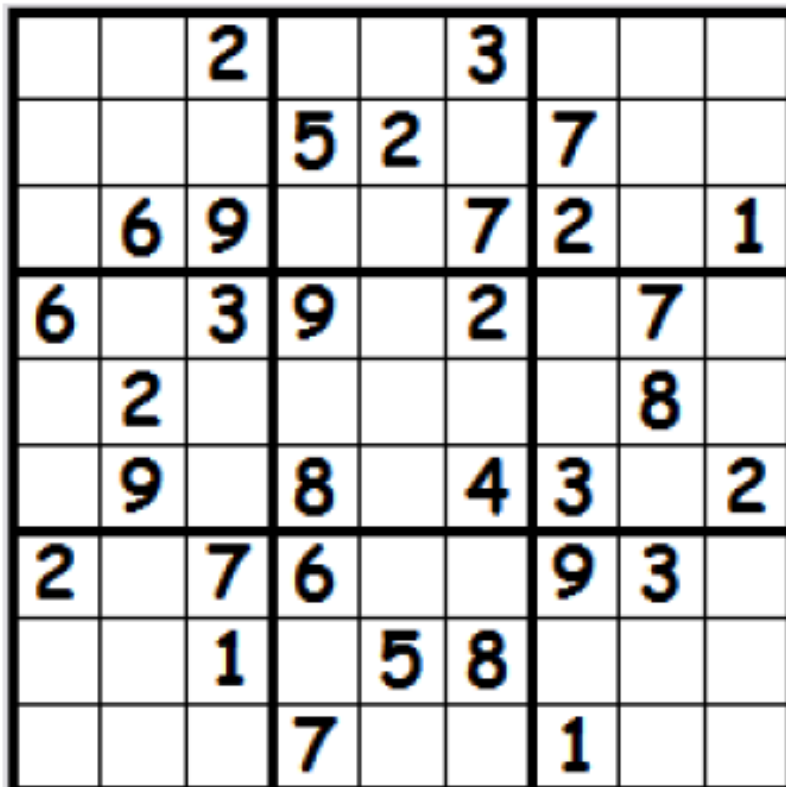

CHEESE TO PLEASE YOU

All you countless Archers fans out there may recall an episode a couple of weeks back in which two of the characters enjoyed a cheese board of local cheeses. Now, clearly we don't live in Ambridge (although sometimes I feel like I do), and so we don't have any of Helen Archer's excellent 'Borsetshire Blue' to sample. But there are plenty of other cheeses to try out from our very own Wootton Stores, which – just like the Village Shop in Ambridge – is a community-run enterprise, staffed by volunteers. We wanted to keep you informed about the progress of your Neighbourhood Plan and what the next steps will be.

WOOTTON EVOLUTION EXHIBITION FEEDBACK

Firstly, a huge thank you for your amazing support with Wootton's Evolution Exhibition held in St Mary's Church, Wootton from 9th March – 7th April 2024. We would like to thank Ann Leggett and St Marys' Church for being so actively helpful, generously allowing us to host the event for free and suggesting that due to the high level of interest, we extend the exhibition's time frame by an extra week! We are also very grateful to Mike Hallam and Nicholas Tomlinson for allowing us to access the carefully curated "Wootton History Collection" files. A big thank you also goes to Zoe Wheeler for promoting us on the Wootton-by-Woodstock website and to Tim Watson who gave up his time and

expertise to film the entire exhibition and store it on app.Mural.co. A special thank you goes to the people who helped design posters, find and print maps, provide display & sandwich boards, lent & donated precious, parish heirlooms, painted our post box, lent bunting, donated wine, visited the Oxford History Centre and gave their own free time to help out and/or also host the wine and nibbles exhibition evening! Thank you everybody for your help and support!

119 people signed the Exhibition



Visitors' books. We received nearly 70 completed Post Cards that asked, "What do you wish for Wootton's Neighbourhood in the future?" and also received numerous emails and detailed written submissions from many of you. You will not be surprised to learn that you really love and care about your Neighbourhood! Recalling the Exhibition Sections of "Our History," "Landscape and Green Spaces," "Infrastructure/Transport," "Built

Environment" (Community and Residential) it was "Infrastructure/Transport" that generated the most comments with "Built Environment" generating the second largest number of responses. However, there was important feedback given for the other sections and these will be considered within our next steps. Thank you everyone who provided feedback, your voice matters and helps towards the development our Neighbourhood Plan, often listed as NP.

MAY 14TH NEIGHBOURHOOD

STEERING COMMITTEE MEETING

Your Neighbourhood Steering Committee has 12 members - some of whom are 'core' and others who join for short periods depending on their interest and skills. They are all part of our community and the group has been created to represent the diverse, vibrant neighbourhood of Wootton Parish with people from different locations, age profiles and socio-economic groups.

Clare Richards kindly attended this meeting to provide advice to assist us with considering how we all keep engaged in the process of producing our Neighbourhood plan and what our next steps might be. Clare grew up in Wootton and generously donated the beautiful new Church doors. Her background as a film maker & architect assisted

her in founding a very successful charity called "Footwork" which supports locally led projects that improve communities. One of their core values is that locals should drive their project from the grass roots rather than having something thrust upon them. Thank you, Clare, for your time and expertise and for your exciting assistance with our NP Survey to come! Watch this space everybody!

So, in short, we will really need your continued interest, participation and support for Wootton to benefit from our future Neighbourhood Plan.

WOOTTON NP SURVEY

You are probably wondering what happens next? Our NP must comply with a statutory procedure to ensure we consult and engage with many groups connected to Wootton Parish. In addition to consulting local residents we are now in the process of meeting with stakeholders connected to our parish such as local businesses, transport organisations and other bodies including community groups such as: The Village Hall, Burditch Bar, Sports clubs, Wootton Conservation Trust and so on. From all of this feedback, the NP Steering Committee will draft a more detailed and focussed Wootton Neighbourhood Plan Survey for you all to have your say about your wishes for Wootton's

NP in the future and you will be able to complete it either on paper, online or verbally.

WHY SHOULD WE HAVE A WOOTTON NP SURVEY?

From this more detailed NP survey, we expect the findings will enable the NP Steering Committee to scope out Wootton's future Neighbourhood Plan with real goals and policies. You will have the chance to have your final say on that with a Wootton referendum! Don't panic, don't think Brexit! Many parish councils held NP Referendums and survived the process, leaving their communities intact and in possession of a statutory NP.

SAVE THE DATE: Wootton Flower Show, Saturday 7th September 2024 from 2pm.



We shall will be launching the Wootton Neighbourhood Plan Survey at our own stand with your neighbours who are members of the NP Steering Committee. They should be able to help you with any queries and will have copies of the Wootton NP Survey. There are over

600 people in our Parish, so we want everyone to have their chance to have their say and wish for a 100% response rate, a very optimistic goal! But we know that we are an exceptional Neighbourhood, as you said in your feedback so far, we have great "Community Spirit" and that you "love how many villagers give so generously of their time and effort to make Wootton special." So, we know you care passionately about Wootton, and fingers crossed all of us will complete our Wootton NP survey! We might also deploy a few "carrots" to get as many of you as possible to complete your WNP Survey too! Watch that space! WOOTTON VILLAGE HALL TALKS

Susie Dent, from Dictionary Corner on Channel Four's Countdown, was our final speaker of the summer in a packed hall on June 14th (the 135th Talk). Susie was delayed in the queue behind a serious car accident and hadn't been able to go home to get her notes - but she spoke with wonderful fluency and insight into the fascinating use of English - for instance, the history of

why letters, such as the "b" in doubt don't feature in their pronunciation, as well as the "h" in ghost - which was put there by an anonymous person centuries ago and remains with us to this day. She also shared curious stories like the phrase "stealing somebody's thunder" with its origins in the world of theatre and "licking things into shape" - originally when a mother-bear licks a cub into a life-form after birth. Susie also revealed the ancient English "law" that means we will never play "pong ping" or wear "flop flips", and

pondered the disappearance of such words as kempt and ruly (and she pointed out, you really can be "grunted").

She also delved into "American English" and offered the background to words in the US like color and favorite not having a "u". In fact, these were the spellings in England centuries ago but Dr Johnson added a "u" to words, often with a French root, for his dictionary and these have remained.

Susie suggested that English is one of the world's great languages and is constantly changing, with different generations adding words or creating their own vocabulary or symbols, like emojis - of which she is a fan. Through it all, she said English is in terrific shape - and its variety and history is something to be treasured.

The following day, it was announced Susie had been awarded an MBE in the King's Birthday Honours List for services to Language and Literature - but she had been sworn to secrecy and so was unable to share the news with us on the night.

In May, the Olympic sprinter Peter Radford gave a captivating description of how, as a teenager, he had read a book by the British-Trinidadian sprinter, McDonald Bailey, on how to run fast - and this

inspired him to train hard until he rose rapidly from coming third in races to winning on most occasions.

He went on to be one of one of Britain's greatest sprinters at 100 and 200 metres and at one time held the world record for 200 metres. He became a key part of British teams, travelling the world to major competitions, and this culminated in the 1960 Olympic Games in Rome where he won the Bronze Medal in the 100 metres and also the Bronze in the Men's 4x100 metres relay. Later, he won Gold in the 4x100 metres relay at the Commonwealth Games in Australia.

In the early days, Peter funded his training with various jobs, including selling encyclopedias but, after his athletics career finished through injury, he went on to be a leading academic setting up Sports Departments at universities. He also established early drugs-testing procedures for competitors which, he suggested, were far more sophisticated these days

Proceeds from Peter's evening - as well as Susie Dent's - led to a total of £16,234.15 raised for the Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal since March 2022

Wootton Nature Kids group met up again on 8th June, for an exploration of insects in the Meadows. Our first find, however was not an insect but a beautiful common lizard basking in the new 'dead hedge' - a first recording for the Meadows!



As the weather was cold and windy (not so good for insect spotting), we started by working to add more wood to the dead hedge, weaving in twigs and branches and leaving small spaces for insects and other creatures to hide away.



We also made 'tin can bug hotels' using the offcuts, so we could take a bug habitat home too. As the weather warmed, we set off

to find some of the fabulous insects that make their home on the meadow.

We spotted many bumblebees, a few butterflies and lots of thick-legged beetles, their metallic green



showing up well on the buttercups.

To great excitement, we also spotted our 'not an insect' target – a beautiful bee orchid!

It was a real joy to be outside with a group of young people taking such an active interest

in their local wildlife – as Joe said, "This is paradise!"

The recently laid hedge is thriving, and wildlife is making use of the “dead hedge” created from the brash generated by the laying. Participants in the Children’s Saturday nature club, hosted by Sarah Brown, even found a Common Lizard basking in its

Maintenance work is largely completed for the hedgerows this year, although we will shortly be seeking volunteers for a work party to clear up some of the debris generated – watch Wootton WhatsApp pages for news.

At the end of July, once the wildflowers have set seed, we will be introducing sheep again to the fields to help control the grass. This will mean the closure of certain paths for one day, starting with Dorn Warren Bank, in order to install the sheep and electric fences where needed.
