**N** EWS FROM WOOTTON PC The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on 14 November at 7.30 in the Village Hall. This is the meeting at which the budget and council tax level for next year will be set. We had a preliminary

discussion on the budget for next year at our October meeting, as there are difficult choices to be made if we are to continue to provide our local services and support local organisations. We need to rebuild our reserves, which have been used to bring the Burditch Hall back into use, cope with increasing costs being charged to us (for example for grass cutting, emptying litter bins, etc.) and meeting the requests for grant aid from local village organisations which rely on our support. We reviewed the level of the parish council tax which we pay here in Wootton and found that it is among the lowest in the county. We have therefore decided at this point that after several years of the tax remaining at the same level, we do need to think about an increase for next year. The decision on how much will be made at the November meeting, when we have all the requests for grant aid available for us to consider.

Meanwhile, we are waiting for the District Returning Officer to announce the date for the election to fill the vacancy left by Joan Thomas's retirement. At the time Outreach went to press, it had still not been announced but, when we hear, notices will go up on the notice board, in the shop, and on our website
