SPEEDING TRAFFIC

We received a progress report on the continuing efforts to encourage more motorists to keep closer to the speed limit. (Thank you to all of you who do.) A Community SpeedWatch group is being set up and is currently applying to the Thames Valley Police for formal accreditation. Training and equipment will be made available by the TVP and the group will be able to report speeding to the police. Anyone who is worried about excessive speed through the village and would like the join the group should contact Mel Leggett. Apart from that, there are still 20mph stickers for wheelie bins available from the shop if you would like one.

CORONATION TREES

Marcus Brown is leading on the project to plant some trees this winter to commemorate the Coronation earlier in the year. Advice has been taken on appropriate species and the locations proposed in Castle Road. The council is now appealing to local people or firms to sponsor some of the trees. If you would like to offer sponsorship, please contact Marcus or me direct. BURDITCH BANK ASH TREES There is concern among the residents of Burditch bank about the state of the ash trees overhanging the road. The

probable last owners of Burditch bank before it was adopted as a highway have now been identified and we have passed the details to the county council. Following the meeting, our county councillor visited the site and we had a helpful discussion. He agrees there is a risk of large branches falling into the road and is seeing whether the county council can remove these before they do. IMPROVING LOCAL TRAVEL The council is now part of the network of parish councils around Woodstock working on ways to improve local travel options and to lobby for road safety improvements. We have produced a map and schedule showing the improvements being proposed. This is available on both the PC and Wootton village websites.

CREATING A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

As part of the council's work to develop a neighbourhood plan for the parish, the council would like to set up a steering committee where a wider group of people from the village can have a substantial input. We think such a plan would be an important step in influencing the sort of development permitted in the village and what is discouraged. But it is vital that the plan really reflects the views of local people and that is the purpose of the p10 steering group. If you are 22

Amanda Salter created her usual rocky-roads as well as a fabulous inscribed birthday cake. Jayne Day once again supplied the sandwiches - having done so for every talk over the past 15 years - and the evening raised over 650 Pounds for the Ukraine Appeal Over the years, the Talks Teams
