THE PARISH COUNCIL The council didn't meet in August and our last meeting was in July after Outreach had gone to press. The main purpose of the meeting was to agree our response to the 'targeted consultation' on amendments to the proposed boundaries of the Botley West site. We noted that far from pushing back the boundaries to reduce the visual intrusion, as we had asked for in our earlier submission, the developers now want to make the site area larger, and create internal access routes for maintenance purposes. Included in their

proposals is the use of Dornford Lane as one of the access routes for maintenance. The council was very disturbed by the proposals and a copy of our detailed response is available on our website: www.woottonparishcouncil.com Aside from Botley West, concerns were raised at the meeting about reduced visibility at road junctions caused by overgrown vegetation. The situation at the Rousham road/ B4027 junction was felt to be especially dangerous. While cutting verges for road safety reasons is primarily the responsibility of the county council, the PC stepped in as an emergency to cut back the undergrowth at this location.

Residents of Castle Road will be aware that we still have a real problem with the general verge maintenance. The council is very sorry that our contractor has still not visited the village to cut it back. We are looking hard at trying to bring in another contractor, but it is almost impossible to find one willing to take on the work. There seems to be much more work available overall than there are contractors available to do it, with the result that contractors choose the easiest and most profitable options. Meanwhile we are grateful to those local residents who have looked after the grass areas immediately outside their houses. Our guest at 7.30pm on Friday October 11th is Professor Angela Gallop, one of the world's leading forensic scientists. Her findings helped solve notorious cases such as the killings of Stephen Lawrence, Rachel Nickell, Roberto Calvi, Lynette White, Damilola Taylor and Gareth Williams. She also took part in the investigation of the death of Diana, Princess of Wales, finding no evidence to support theories of a conspiracy.

In 1991, Angela was hired to reexamine the evidence on the apparent hanging-suicide at Blackfriars Bridge of Italian banker, Roberto Calvi. She had gained a reputation for unconventional methods and conducted experiments with her husband, who shared Calvi's proportions proving that Calvi could not have hanged himself and that he was murdered.

In 2010, Angela helped found Axiom International, which provides forensic and related advice to law enforcement agencies worldwide - and she subsequently worked in Libya, Iraq, Somaliland and Kosovo. Angela was played by Nancy Carroll in the 2021 series, called Stephen, a drama following the fight for justice for Stephen Lawrence. She was also a guest on Desert Island Discs in October 2022.

A free audio local news service for the visually impaired, Witney Talking News was founded in 1979 by Peter Brading with the help of Witney Round Table. A group of volunteers records a one-hour session each week of items in local media. USB memory sticks are then posted to listeners to be played on a free, easy-to-use playback unit. Most of the clients live in or close to Witney but as the memory sticks are sent free through the post there's no effective limit. The service is also available to people who have difficulty holding newspapers. Readings are from the Witney Gazette, which often carries articles from further afield, the Chipping Norton News and Thames Valley Police Alerts online. The weekly broadcasts also include local sport, a guiz and a short reflections item. Access can also be made by ringing 01993 555986, though the call would be charged at BT rates.
