

Dear friends,
Easter falls quite early this year, on April 5th — not the earliest possible day, but early enough that Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, will take us by surprise in mid-February. There will be a service of holy communion with imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday, 18th February at 12.15pm. All are very welcome.

This year, rather than giving something up in Lent, I plan to try to read more: and by that I mean real, physical books. Like many people, I have felt my attention span dribbling away with the short-form content fed to us by our phones. Two things have helped to slow the mind: putting pen literally to paper, and picking up books the way I did as a child and young adult before so much of what I read for work and study was on a screen. To cultivate deeper attention is an act of resistance in a world whose technological giants profit from our distraction.

You'll see, below, the cover of what looks to be an excellent Lent read. "Wardrobes and Rings: Through Lenten Lands with the Inklings," contains bite-sized devotions and meditations for each day in Lent, all from work by the authors who made up the famous Inklings, a mid-20th-century group of Oxford writers and thinkers who met in the Eagle and Child pub (also called the Bird and Baby by locals, occasionally called the Fowl and Foetus by me) to discuss their work and read extracts aloud to each other. They included CS Lewis (of the Narnia books) and JRR Tolkien (Lord of the Rings and The Hobbit). We'll meet a few times during Lent for an informal book club, but locations and times will vary, so please email me directly to be added to the mailing list.

GREEN FINGERS



I'm always glad when February rolls around. It sits between Winter's hold and Spring's promise. For a gardener, there's lots to be excited about. Light levels are starting to extend. Bare trees make for dramatic backgrounds at sunset and hopefully all that hard work bulb planting in autumn is paying off. This plant of the month was more difficult than I first thought and surprisingly I found myself spoilt for choice. This month, I've chosen one of my favourite shrubs. February's plant of the month: Nandina domestica or Heavenly Bamboo. Pictured here at Greys Court. A major caveat to its common name: it is not a bamboo. So you won't upset the neighbours by planting it next to the fence! It belongs to the same family as Berberis. It has bright red berries and an elegant upright form. It's evergreen so keeps its place all year round in the back of a mixed border. In time it will mature to 2 m or you can trim to suit (after the last frost). It also comes with interesting autumn foliage to boot! In autumn the tips tend to turn red and orange and it carries those memories lightly at this time of the year which makes



for a pleasing blend. My top tip is to cut out the foliage and any branches that grow out from the lower third. I think this leaves the shrub in a much more upright shape and shows it off almost like a bouquet of flowers. The clearer base also gives you another advantage : more room , which means space for some more bulbs of course! Its red berries could contrast well with clumps of Snowdrops or white daffodils such as 'Thalia'.





W OOTTON PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

DO YOU FEEL YOU KNOW WHAT'S GOING ON IN WOOTTON? Do you feel left out? Might this be because of where in the village you live? These were questions discussed at the Parish Council meeting in early January. There are lots of ways of finding out what's happening in our village. There's Outreach - which you're reading at the moment. Perhaps you are on the village WhatsApp group too? or you look on WoottonbyWoodstock.co.uk? But are these enough? One idea which has been suggested is to have more noticeboards for

local groups to use. For example there could be one near the Milford Lane entrance to Jubilee Meadows, or possibly one near the Burditch hall. Do you think these might help or would they just be filled up with out of date flyers from outsiders?

WE WANT TO KNOW WHAT YOU THINK. Just send us an email (clerk@woottonbywoodstock-pc.gov.uk) or speak to your local parish councillor.

The other main item of interest discussed was an update on the **PROPOSED CHANGES TO THE A44/ B4022 JUNCTION AT JUDDS GARAGE.** For many years there have been concerns about the safety of the junction which has seen too many fatal crashes. And with more traffic nowadays the accident rate looks to be increasing.

So the county council is planning big changes which we have been supporting. These will involve installing traffic lights to control vehicles turning on to the A44 and allow pedestrians to cross safely. New bus stops with proper bus shelters and live departure screens will be put up on both sides of the road. If all goes to plan then these changes should be in place later this year.

Finally, **OUR NEXT MEETING WILL BE ON MONDAY 2ND MARCH** when we want the main item to be a discussion on the next steps in our Neighbourhood Plan. If you are interested then come along - we're not as far as Oxford or Witney and unlike the "big" councils, you can actually have a say...

WOOTTON VILLAGE HALL TALKS

In January VALENTINE LOW, former Royal Correspondent on The Times, gave a fascinating insight into the role of courtiers at the Palace and how they work alongside the Royal Family, not always harmoniously. Relations with Downing Street can also be fraught but Valentine shared the touching time The Queen, at her 80th birthday party, took Margaret Thatcher, in the early stages of dementia, by the hand and led her round the room. The evening, at a packed church, raised £935 for the Ukraine Appeal - leading to a total of £27,632.21 since March 2022

The speaker at our 150TH TALK at 7.30pm on February 6th is JULIE SUMMERS, who makes a much-anticipated return to talk about her

official history of British Vogue
In recent years, Julie has spoken brilliantly in Wootton about George Mallory and Sandy Irvine (her great-uncle) who may have been the first to summit Mount Everest in the 1920s - as well as her grandfather, Colonel Philip Toosey, and his involvement with the Bridge on the River Kwai in World War Two
But for our landmark evening, she will be breaking new ground and talking about her book, British Vogue - Fashion, Power and a Century of Change, which took four years to research and write, combing through 1,800 issues
Vogue has always been far more than just a fashion magazine. For more than a century it has defined the tastes and style of successive generations, playing a leading role in the continuing story of Britain's national identity.

Founded in 1916 as a remedy to wartime shipping restrictions faced by the American publisher Condé

Nast, British Vogue has forged its own path from the very start. From the trauma of the wartime years through to the freedom of the Swinging Sixties, the rise of the supermodel to the ground-breaking editorial direction of Edward Enninfu, the first black Editor-in-Chief - the magazine's chameleonic ability to move with the times has ensured its perennial status at the vanguard of British cool. And now, for the first time, Julie has told its turbulent and glamorous history. She was given unique access to images from the Vogue archive and behind-the-scenes interviews with Vogue insiders such as stylist Grace Coddington, longest-serving Editor Alexandra Shulman (who spoke at our 100th event) and Fashion Editor, Lucinda Chambers. It is the story of a legend and the individuals who created (and curated) it, told against the backdrop of an extraordinary century of change, upheaval and beauty.

Entry for this event in St Mary's Church is £10 in cash - and includes free food. Children over 16 welcome. Cards can be used to buy copies of Julie's book.





The wet winter flooding of the Glyme and Dorn Water Meadows, has seen them doing their job in slowing the flow of water downstream, meaning that you may need wellies if taking the path towards Hordley.

The abundance of berries, particularly Hawthorn, has attracted flocks of Redwing and a few Fieldfare, our regular visiting winter Thrushes. This is also the time of year when the resident Song Thrushes start to sing from the treetops, and one can distinguish individual birds by the different phrases of their songs.



We have now installed our new information board near the Milford Lane gate, and thanks are due to Rosa Wheeler for the delightful artwork. We will be laying the remainder of the hedgerow between Round Top and Dorn Warren Bank in late winter as part of our hedgerow regeneration program.

In the near future we will be closing the Meadows for 24 hours in order to maintain the permissive pathways. Notice will be posted on the gates and on Wootton WhatsApp.


