HELP IN TIME OF NEED

N EWS FROM WOOTTON PARISH COUNCIL

There was no meeting in October but the next meeting of the parish council will be on Monday 3rd November at 7.30 in the village hall. But we do have an update on a couple of important local issues: **DO YOU TRAVEL INTO OXFORD?** If so, you need to know that from 29th October there will be a congestion charging system in Oxford. If you go through one of the zone 'gates' between 7.00 am and 7.00 pm, mainly around the city centre, you will incur a daily £5 charge. The system is temporary and designed to manage the volume of traffic caused by the continued

closure of the Botley road. At the same time, bus travel from the Oxford P&R car parks to the city centre (and back) is going to be free for three months. Residents in Wootton and our part of Oxfordshire can apply for a free permit to allow 25 trips a year without charge through the charge zone.

Everyone should have had a leaflet with more information through their letterbox but full details of the scheme, the free P&R buses, and how to apply for your free permit are on the County Council's website: oxfordshire.gov.uk/congestioncharge and oxfordshire.gov.uk/freepark&ride




OOTTON: A HAVEN IN
A CHANGING WORLD.

We are often quick to see issues and point out what's wrong with the world.

Today, I want to write about something that makes me incredibly proud to call Wootton my home.

My family's story is one of great journeys. My parents were born in British India, and their world was turned upside down by the Partition of 1947. They were part of the horrific exodus that created Pakistan, leaving their ancestral homes behind. A generation later, in response to a call from the British government, they came to England in their 20s to help rebuild this beautiful country after the war.

I was born in Oxford in the mid-1960s, a time of great social change. Growing up, my brown skin sometimes made me a target for hostile attention. To be fair and balanced, I also met wonderful people who saw beyond colour and coaxed the best out of me. Over the decades, our country changed immensely, becoming one of the most diverse and tolerant societies in the world.

Recently, however, the national mood has felt different. Brexit, economic hardship, and the rise of divisive politics have created a need



for scapegoats, and I see the media and some politicians trying to escalate divisions. Sadly, this isn't

just on television. When I am out and about in other places, I have occasionally started to see those old, "unfriendly faces" again. It's a familiar and unwelcome energy, a reminder of a past I had hoped was long gone. But then I come home to Wootton.

Many years ago, when my wife, Wanda, and I first moved here, I wrote an article about how amazing everyone was in welcoming us. Now, all these years later, and despite the worrying trends nationally, that feeling has only deepened. Never have I felt a greater sense of belonging than I do in this village.

We have a beautiful community here, one that I feel fully a part of. The energy of love, kindness, and acceptance that flows through Wootton is something I hold very close to my heart. It feels like a sanctuary, immune to the passing storms of national politics. Because of you all, I feel secure, happy, and truly at home.

I know this village will not change its character, because that spirit of community is not an accident—it is who we are.

Thank you, Wootton. Thank you all.

WOOTTON VILLAGE HALL TALKS

In October, Harriet Rix, a leading tree scientist, gave a highly informative and energised talk on her book, *The Genius of Trees*, which examines how trees have shaped the Earth over millions of years - in many more ways than had been previously appreciated.

Harriet, who has also worked on mine-clearance in Iraq, told us trees are an awesome force in Nature and have woven the world into a place of great beauty and extraordinary variety. The key evolutionary moment was when algae managed to survive the deadly UV light on land after emerging from the sea. This allowed a whole new chemistry to emerge, root and branch, in a new place - dry land - and these photosynthesising cells started on a path that led to the amazing complexity of trees.

Trees used their biochemical wizardry to transform the Earth from a stoney, storm-ravaged wasteland into a place where life could thrive. They broke barren rock into soil, canalised flood waters into rivers, pumped oxygen into the atmosphere, and turned the desert green.

Element by element, Harriet said trees have learned to control water, air, fire and the ground beneath us, as well as fungi, plants, animals, and even people. But she gave short shrift to subsequent anthropomorphic claims that trees “talk” or “love” or “mother” one another.

She suggested we can smell the genius of trees in the rich terpenes given off by trees to seed clouds, generating rain and expanding their own habitats as well as the genius you can taste in the sweet fruit that makes animals do trees’ bidding, and arguably gave our simian ancestors their brains. Our clever fingers evolved to grip their branches - and Harriet suggested this is why we find the smell of wood so comforting, and why we like to press our noses between the pages of books.

Over 100 people filled St Mary's Church - and the evening raised £733 for the Ukraine Appeal - making a total since March 2022 of £26,067. Our next speaker, at 7.30pm on Friday November 7th is TOM HEAP, one of the country's leading environmental writers and broadcasters - often featuring on BBC One's *Countryfile*, specialising in investigations and Radio 4's *Costing the Earth*, as well as the anchor on *The Climate Show* on Sky News. Tom has also worked on the *Today*

programme and presented editions of Panorama covering food, energy and the environment. He is also the anchor of Radio 4's new Rare Earth series and was the creator and presenter of BBC Radio's flagship climate-change podcast, 39 Ways to Save the Planet

In Wootton, Tom will be talking about his latest book, Land Smart - in which he discusses how we require land for so many of our expanding needs, such as food, renewable energy, carbon storage and housing. Traditionally, says Tom, we've stolen it from Nature,

but this has led to a mounting toll of extinction and pollution that is now punishing us. So, as there's no land left to take, Tom asks - how do we get more from the same space? Entry for this event in St Mary's Church is £10 in cash - and includes free food. Drinks available for a modest donation. (Children over 16 welcome). Cards can be used to buy copies of Land Smart

NOISE DISTURBANCE FROM AIRCRAFT?

WHAT THE PARISH COUNCIL ARE DOING.

Two parish councillors and one other resident of Wootton attended the October meeting organised by the Oxford Airport consultative committee. This covers all matters related to the airport including the new Science Park development near the airport. One of the items on the agenda was the continued noise over different parishes neighbouring the airport, although the overall situation remains unchanged.

Most occurrences of noise are from light aircraft and helicopters over the village. However, we and the Oxford Airport are limited in what can be done in some ways because the airspace above us is classified as uncontrolled. The airport's air traffic controllers are keen to emphasise that they don't direct low level flights over the local built-up areas. They also would like to make clear that not all flights above Wootton are from or bound for Oxford Airport.

Oxford Airport does have a noise abatement policy. This provides pilots with guidelines of the preferred routes around the local area such as between Woodstock and Wootton. But whilst pilots are obliged to read the policy, they don't necessarily have to follow this.

However, the airport does have a complaints procedure, and we encourage you to complain directly to Oxford Airport about specific flights you feel are a nuisance. It is very important to send information they can use to identify the pilot, so do include date, time, location (as best you can) and some description of the aircraft. The airport does treat complaints seriously and collects the data to understand hotspots and just as importantly, the lack of complaints as evidence to Civil Aviation Authority.

The full details of the complaints procedure and the noise abatement policy can be found on their website at <https://www.oxfordairport.co.uk/community-noise-environment/>. We recommend emailing noisecomplaints@londonoxfordairport.com. Please copy your email to the clerk at the Parish Council clerk@woottonbywoodstock-pc.gov.uk to be collated for WPC Airport Advisory Group. This will enable us to better understand the extent of the issue and follow up with the airport.

We suggested Oxford Airport should visit and explain the legality of what they can and can't do regarding flights that are a nuisance so that villagers can better understand. Please email the clerk if you are interested in attending a future meeting.

In winter / spring, she recommends Colesbourne Park Gardens for its amazing snowdrop display, which is so popular you may need to book ahead.

Also good for snowdrops and other spring bulbs is Painswick Rococo Garden, with the added bonus of its attractive romantic follies. Cotswold Farm Garden opens regularly in February for people to admire its snowdrops. Westonbirt, the National Arboretum, though known for its autumn colour, is also

spectacular in the spring, with its huge rhododendrons, camellias and magnolias thanks to its acid soil.

For summer, Mandy suggests Miserden Park gardens and Sudely Castle and Gardens. One other garden she really admires is Temple Guiting Manor, but sadly this is no longer open to the public to view the gardens. If you wish to see it, you need to organise an eye-wateringly expensive wedding or family gathering!

In autumn we have the ever-reliable Batsford Gardens, so good for leaf colour as well as berries. And don't forget Aston Pottery locally which really comes into its own at this time of the year.

For a garden that looks lovely at any time of the year, Mandy likes to visit Cerney House Garden. An absolute gem, this garden is also open all year via an honesty box.


