HELP IN TIME OF NEED



Dear friends,
Autumn has definitely arrived. The wind tunnel on Castle Road is so powerful sometimes that I worry I'll be swept away into the next parish. I hope you, too, have so far managed to keep your feet safely on the ground.

What's most satisfying about autumn, I think, is the harvest-time change of colour and texture, as nature finally produces, with a grand flourish, what it's been working on all year. In September we celebrated Harvest Festival in church, and it was wonderful to have collected so much for the West Oxfordshire food bank: another, and much needed, kind of harvest.

This is also the time of year when a Rector's mind turns to thoughts of fundraising. It may surprise you to know that churches receive no

public or government funding, and so need to raise around £50,000 per year ourselves to keep our three churches open for life events for the whole community - baptisms, weddings, and funerals, let alone Village Hall Talks and other non-religious events - because these gorgeous old buildings are constantly in need of repair and refurbishment in order to keep them functioning. This is really impossible without community support, and for a while we've been running at a loss of about £10,000 per year.

I want to emphasize that the buildings in Wootton, Glympton, and Kiddington belong to all of us, but especially to you — they are open to everyone and will be there when you need them — and so we really need your support to keep them that way.

WOOTTON PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council met again at the beginning of September. We welcomed our new Parish Clerk, Rachel Faulkner, to her first meeting. If you need to contact her then her email is:

Apart from that, there were no significant decisions taken but we were briefed on a number of important matters.

NEW SURGERY FOR WOODSTOCK.

The good news is that the regional Integrated Care Board has agreed to make funding available for the new surgery and if a site can be secured and planning consent agreed then we could be looking at an opening in early 2028. But the site is not yet agreed. Two possibilities are being looked at; one on the site of the old Owen Mumford premises, and the other in a new development on the edge of the town. There should be a public consultation on the options early next year.

OXFORD CONGESTION CHARGE

This is a controversial project in Oxford which is due to be trialled next year. If it is, one of the measures to be included looks likely to be the suspension of the park-and-ride parking charges and fares.

IMPROVEMENTS TO A44/B4437

JUNCTION AT JUDD'S GARAGE

Plans for the redesign of this junction are currently being worked

on. Apart from the prime objective of improving safety for both pedestrians and traffic, it should enable a bus shelter to be installed, which will benefit those using the S3 service to Oxford.

OVERHANGING HEDGE IN MILLFORD LANE

Concerns about this hedge which is now seriously overhanging the road were raised by a villager at the meeting. The standard advice is to log problems on fixmystreet/Oxfordshire but County Cllr Andy Graham agreed to have a look for himself and if needed encourage officers to take action.

There is still some content we need to load onto it but do have a look at it and tell us what you think.

Our next Meeting will be on Monday 3rd November at 7.30 pm and as usual will be open to the public.

It has just been announced that the result of the election for the vacant seat on the Parish Council is that Dr Jonathan Reynolds has been elected. Jonathan has lived in the village for over 30 years. In the past, he has served on the governing body of Wootton school and for a time was the chair of governors.





We reported all the work that has been done in the last 18 months on the NP to WODC and are delighted to let you know that they are happy with our progress so far, that we have complied with the correct procedures and engaged as thoroughly as possible with all members of our community. We will have completed the Wootton business surveys by the end of October. We are forming another NP Steering Committee with some data gathering and legal expertise who will meet in October in order to progress the survey results towards drafting potential policies that will be presented to you by WODC to vote on in a ...Referendum. If you have any queries please to do not hesitate to contact the Parish Councillors who are also on the NP Steering committee: Frances Bates, David Knight and Fiona Mackinlay.

NP SURVEY: HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE CONSOLIDATED RESPONSES

- Almost 80% of respondents have lived in Wootton for more than 15 years and 95% state that Wootton is their main home.
- 98% felt that it is very important to retain the distinctiveness and separation of the village from Woodstock.
- On the subject of "housing development," the number of people finding the suggested locations acceptable was close to equal for every suggestion. A high

proportion -72%- considered that it was most important for any new housing to have similar appearance to the existing housing and to fit in visually. This was a higher proportion than for any other suggestions about design.

- If there is any new housing development, the highest proportion of responses stated that the most important planning criteria are restrictions on height of buildings (70%) and the protection of existing trees, hedgerows and dry-stone walls (78%)
- Just over half the households in Wootton have one or more dogs. (114 dogs in total from those who responded)
- On the introduction of additional circular footpaths, 82% said they would use them.
- 77% said they 'would' or 'may' use a park and ride at Oxford Airport.
- 76% agreed or strongly agreed that there is a problem with parking in the centre of Wootton.
- The most popular suggestion for additional sports and recreation facilities was...a swimming area in the river!
- There was near equal acceptance of the suggestions for the use of the school, with the most popular being 'any use of community benefit to the village' (36%) with 20% agreeing with any development that retains the physical character of the building.

WOOTTON VILLAGE HALL TALKS

In September, David Rooney returned to give a magisterial talk on the earliest attempts to fly non-stop across the Atlantic. He told us many people assume the first to make the crossing was Charles Lindbergh when he flew from New York to Paris in 1927 - but it was Captain John Alcock and Lieutenant Arthur Whitten Brown who first managed the feat in 1919 and their remarkable achievement features in his wonderful book, *The Big Hop*. Probably the main reason Alcock and Brown's crossing in 1919 has been forgotten, added David, is that their journey did not prove to be the start of a brave new world of flying. It would be eight years before newspapers used the term "Atlantic Fever" to describe public interest in crossing the ocean by plane. Alcock and Brown were not the first team to leave Newfoundland, in Canada, when they set off in a Vickers Vimy biplane from a field just outside St John's on 14th June 1919, but they were the only plane to land on the other side of the ocean, in a bog near Clifden, County Galway, 15 hours and 57 minutes later. The two airmen, said David, had battled heavy snow, blinding fog

and mechanical failures to make the successful trip - before collecting the £10,000 Daily Mail aviation prize for their achievement from Winston Churchill. Their feat ranks with the first Apollo landing on the Moon in July 1969.

David spent some of his working life at London's Science Museum.

Among the many striking exhibits is Allcock and Brown's ungainly plane, in its final resting place at the museum, and he said it emphasizes the enormity of the triumph of these two giants of aviation.

The evening, with over 100 people in St Mary's Church, raised just over £700 for the Ukraine Appeal - leading to a total of £25,344 since

Before joining this sector, Harriet worked in landmine clearance in the Middle East and is a trustee of the Iraqi environmental charity, Hasar. Harriet will be talking about her widely-praised book, *The Genius of Trees*, which one reviewer described as a mesmerising global story which shows how trees have learned to use the soil, air, water, plants, fungi, fire, animals and people around them to shape our world - possessing powers beyond anything we might have imagined.

From oaks growing in Devon and Amedi in Iraq to the laurel rainforests of the Canary Islands, metasequoias in California and fossil forests preserved from hundreds of millions of years ago - trees not only form the landscape in which they grow, but also manipulate the fundamental elements, other species (and even humans) to achieve their ends.

TONESFIELD
GARDENING CLUB



Our talk in September was given by committee member Dr Lauren Daly who works as education officer at the Oxford Botanic Garden – always good to have home-grown experts to talk to us!

Lauren gave us a very interesting talk on the delights of carnivorous plants, with lovely photographs and videos. The definition of a carnivorous plant is specific – not only must they take in nutrients from dead prey, but they must also

actively lure in, catch and digest prey. The plants that do this use colour, nectar and UV patterns to attract insects and they use snap traps, pitfalls, sticky secretions, suction or a

lobster pot trap to capture the prey. They then digest them with enzymes and bacteria. All in all, very complicated and clever plants.

Plants include Venus Fly Trap, Sundews, pitcher plants (*Sarracenia*) and tropical pitchers (*Nepenthes*).

They are surprisingly easy to grow in our gardens (so she says!) with only *Nepenthes* needing to be indoors all the time.

They need bright sunlight, rainwater and peat-free or poor peat acidic soil. Most can happily be put outside in the summer but do need winter dormancy.

This month we will have a return visit from Mandy Bradshaw, the Chatty Gardener, who will be entertaining us with her wonderful photographs of gardens in the Cotswolds.
